# **BENTHAM TOWN COUNCIL**

#### Minutes of the Council Meeting held on Wednesday 3 January, at 7.30 pm in the Lower Town Hall

- 138.To Receive & Record any member's Disclosable Pecuniary Interest in relation to items on the agenda and to receive and decide members' requests for DPI dispensations
  - Cllr Adams declared a personal interest in item 144.1.3, planning application 2017/18815/HH, as a neighbour of the property. Cllr Marshall declared a DPI on item 144.1.2, planning application 2017/18792/FUL, as the applicant.

141.To Receive the Clerks Report (for information only) – see end of these minutes

Following publication of the agenda notice had been received from Draven District Council that the remaining Recycling Bring Sites, including the one on Grasmere Drive, would be removed from the end of January – following 'abuse' by commercial entities. The Council was unanimous in agreeing that this was a bad move and expressed concern that this would increase fly tipping in the area. Notification had also been received that Craven Concrete had applied for an environmental permit to operate a cement installation at Butts Works. It was agreed that the Council did not need to comment.

142.To Receive the Police Report & allow members to ask questions for information

A written report had been supplied by PCSO Grace. There had been 32 incidents reported in December including 1 burglary and 1 attempted burglary, and other less serious issues. There had been no further reports of antisocial behaviour by youths around the Auction Mart. It had been confirmed that North Yorkshire has the lowest crime rate in England. There were 37359 crimes in the last reported 12mth period, a slight 1% increase on the previous year, contrasting with an overall increase of 13% in recorded crimes in England & Wales.

143. To Receive Reports from CCIIr & DCIIrs (for information only)

DCIIr Brockbank confirmed that the decision to remove the Bring-Sites had been made in December as it was believed that kerb side collection should be sufficient. She pointed out that the decision was not irreversible but any argument against would need to be supported with evidence. Any increase in fly tipping would need to be raised with the District Council.

Her questions regarding the implementation of the VC Winner commemorative stones could not be answered as the dedication service date & form had not been agreed with other interested parties.

The Craven Draft Local Plan has been published for consideration. DCllr Brockbank pointed out that the only comments that could be made are about the soundness of the plan, but also informed the Council that all possible employment land in Bentham had been removed in the final draft.

DCIIr Thompson confirmed that the fly tipping reported on Grasmere Drive car park at the last meeting had been removed, only to be replaced by more, and that this would need monitoring more closely when the Bring Site is removed. He also mentioned that the Craven Data Protection Officer had been invited to the next YLCA Craven Branch meeting to outline their role

There was some discussion regarding the suitability of the windows with the listed nature, but as this was a listed building consent application it was assumed that this would be taken into account.

The Council was unaware that the previous designated employment land had been removed from the final draft of the Local Plan. Craven had expressed a desire to put more employment land in areas with better access (e.g. Ingleton) but Bentham still needs places to work. It was noted that the draft Local Plan did not identify enough employment land for the allocated housing land and agreed that the Council should comment to this effect. As the notification had only been received on 21 December it was agreed to carry this item over to the next agenda, giving Cllrs more time to study the draft Local Plan before commenting

RESOLVED: That the Council comment on the lack of employment land provision in the draft Local Plan

RESOLVED: That the subject be added to the next agenda allowing Cllrs more time to study the draft plan before responding

Due to the late receipt of this information proper study of the document had not been possible

#### 145. Highways Matters

145.1. To receive an update on the various flooding issues raised at the December meeting Environmental Health have agreed to stock a Low Bentham sand bag store if somewhere can be found for it. The clerk has written to the Victoria Institute and a reply is awaited. NYCC's Flood Risk Management Project Officer has agreed to look at Church Beck and photos will be forwarded to them as soon as possible. NYCC Highways are blaming parking on Station Road for the lack of cleaning of gullies, despite the fact that many are under double yellow lines. It was agreed that they should be asked to put out signs before visiting to make sure that cleaning is possible.

<u>RESOLVED:</u> That NYCC Highways be asked to look again at the drains on Station Road and to put out signs prior to their visit to ensure that the gullies are accessible.

<u>RESOLVED:</u> That the Church Beck / Hillcroft problems be followed up with the Flood Risk Management Project Officer

Cllr Adams had met with DCllr Brockbank & Sandra Bailey from Yorkshire Housing regarding the flooding problems on Wesley Avenue and the lagoon on Bargh's Meadow. Yorkshire Housing had agreed to check the outlets.

145.2. To receive a response regarding the footpath at Pye Busk – NYCC Highways will not improve it NYCC Highways do not have a budget for minor improvements. The Council agreed that it should ask if NYCC Highways would adopt it if this pavement was installed to highways standards.

**RESOLVED:** That NYCC Highways be asked if they would adopt this pavement if it was installed to Highways standards

145.3. To receive information from DCllr Brockbank on Grasmere Drive footpath and consider the request to improve lighting in the area.

Craven have completed the improvements in this area to remove the steps. The Council agreed that it would look at improving the lighting. Members of the Open Spaces Committee were meeting with NYCC Street Lighting to progress replacing lights owned by this Council and could add feasibility of possible provision to the list

<u>RESOLVED:</u> That the feasibility of improving the lighting provision on Grasmere Drive footpath be discussed with NYCC Street Lighting

145.4. To Consider and Note Highway Matters for Information

Members of the Open Spaces Committee will meet with Catherine Smith from NYCC Footpaths next week to look at improving the riverside footpath between Low & High Bentham, and also to look at the footpath between Hillside Road and Ellergill.

It was noted that some of the potholes between Low Bentham & Holmes Farm had been filled, but others had been left. There is also a large pothole on Low Bentham Road opposite the entrance to the car park. The state of the road surface in the Lairgill narrows was also mentioned again.

<u>RESOLVED:</u> That NYCC Highways be asked to look at the potholes on the B6480 near St Johns, on Low Bentham Road and in the Lairgill narrows.

One of the Council's street lights on Wenning Avenue is not working. This has already been reported to the contractor and is in hand.

146.To Note the draft minutes of the Marketing Committee meeting on 11 December, and consider recommendations - noted

146.1. To discuss charging for advertising accommodation on the website.

It was agreed that the accommodation list was no longer offering advertisers good value for money, although noted that it was a vehicle to allow businesses involved in tourism to support the TIP. Historically the Council had shied away from advertising on the website but it was agreed that now was the time to reconsider the option. Council agreed that advertisers should be charged £20 plus VAT and asked the Marketing Committee to decide on the detail of the policy.

RESOLVED: That the Council start to charge £20 +VAT for advertising on the website

147. To Discuss the installation of the VC paving stones and how this might be celebrated

It was noted that Bentham is the only place in Craven with VC winners and so this commemoration is important to the whole district. The commemorative paving stones will be arriving on 27 January. It was agreed that they should be delivered to Riverside, where they could be stored until installation. Martin Faichney had agreed to install the stones and a meeting with members of the Council should be arranged to agree placing etc. There was some discussion regarding the dedication of the stones and whether there should be one ceremony or two. The Council voted 6:1 for a single ceremony on a date to be agreed. It was agreed that ClIrs Faraday & Stannard would meet with members of Churches Together to progress format and timing of the ceremony.

**RESOLVED:** That the stones be stored at Riverside Caravan Park

**RESOLVED:** That a meeting be held with Martin Faichney regarding their installation

**RESOLVED:** That Cllrs Stannard & Faraday meet with members of Churches Together to agree the date and format of the dedication service

147.1. To consider the suggestion to move the Town Hall memorial plaque to School Hill

RESOLVED: That the memorial plaque remain on the Town Hall as moving it would be problematic

148.To Receive an offer to provide the service of Data Protection Officer (at a fee) from Craven District Council and agree a response.

The new General Data Protection Regulations are far more onerous than the current data protection requirements, and NALC have suggested that the DPO appointment will be beyond the scope of most clerks.
